

EVALUATION PATTERN: PRIMARY SECTION

Evaluation is an integral part of teaching learning process. The objective of evaluation at primary level is continuous and comprehensive assessment of the growth and the development of the child in various areas of learning set as part of the curriculum. It is child-friendly and is in adherence to the DAVCMC guidelines.

The assessment of students is done throughout the year by means of observation, interaction and specially designed worksheets.

SYSTEM OF EVALUATION

Class 1 and 2

The evaluation process of class 1 and 2 is according to the Early Education Development Program (EEDP) introduced by the DAV Education Board. The program designed intends to help children grow, learn and develop physically, socially, emotionally, morally and intellectually, thus leading to holistic development. Children will be evaluated on the basis of their day to day performance. Formal tests would not be conducted. To check the clarity of concepts, small assessments will be held as class test or surprise test at the end of a particular chapter done or concept given.

Class 3 to 5

To enhance and improve the overall performance of your ward, the system of evaluation for classes 3-5 will be continuous. The whole session is divided into 4 units. In each unit, 20 marks Cycle/Periodic Tests will be conducted per subject. It will be held every Friday as per the schedule given. In addition to pen and paper test, the students will be evaluated on the basis of their class assignment, home assignment, activities, projects which are included under their subject enrichment activities. Emphasis will

be laid on the overall growth and confidence of the child to develop his/her personality. The child will be evaluated in both scholastic and co-scholastic areas. From April end Periodic/Cycle Tests will start. Every Friday, a cycle test will be held in the zero period as per schedule given. Maximum marks allotted will be 20.

- Weekly tests are compulsory for all students.
- In case of absence satisfactory written explanation for absence has to be given to the class teacher.
- Child will not be allowed to leave the school after exam.
- In case the child is not well, parents have to submit an application and medical certificate.
- Even on exam days, late comers will not be allowed to enter the school after 8:00am.
- Information regarding the syllabus of these weekly tests will be given before hand and will also be uploaded on the school website.

Students will maintain class library where students can exchange their books. It will help to inculcate reading habit and will enhance language skills in children.

During the session each month has been allotted a particular subject as a theme based on important days, events and festivals. Related activities will be conducted and it is mandatory for all the students to participate. Student's interaction and performance will be assessed. These will help them to hone their skills, to become more confident, will learn social skills and develop team spirit.

For Class V: After the completion of fourth unit students will appear for a 50 marks test. It will serve as practice for continuous formal exams for which the child has to appear in class 6.

The final result of Class- V will be prepared as follows :
30% of all (Unit Test) + 20% (Internal Assessment) + 50% (Final exam), i.e. , 30% + 20% + 50% = 100%
